St. Ives

JUST FIVE MILES FROM HAYLE IS THE EVER-POPULAR ST IVES, A HISTORIC SEASIDE TOWN CHARACTERISED BY COBBLED STREETS AND INTERESTING QUIRKS THAT DRAW CROWDS FROM FAR AND WIDE TO ITS PRISTINE BEACHES AND BUZZING NIGHTLIFE.

From quiet little pubs and cafés to buzzing bars with sun-filled terraces overlooking the harbour – and a rich art heritage celebrated by a choice of galleries from the small to the world-renowned Tate Gallery, St Ives is able to cater for any mood you find yourself in.

With its fine golden sands and beautiful topaz blue waters,

Porthmeor beach is one of the most popular destinations in Cornwall for surfers with year-round waves, but the white sands and turquoise waters of Porthminster beach is the top pick for holidaymakers. Porthminster hosts St Ives' Food & Drink Festival in mid-September when you can enjoy three days of delicious food, pop-up art galleries and live music.

Hayle's rise to prominence came during the nineteenth-century industrial revolution when steam engine manufacturer Harvey & Co. and iron foundry The Cornish Copper Company established steam engine and copper mining industries in the town. Its working roots remain to this day with a strong local community centred around Hayle's harbour, fishing industry and tourism. Unlike many towns on the Cornish coast, most of Hayle's 9,000 strong community live there year-round and there's a true sense of belonging with familiar faces and warm embraces.

The town's many sporting clubs, pubs, local shops, religious and community groups serve as hubs for people to come together, strengthening neighbourhood ties and creating an atmosphere where it feels as though everyone knows your name. All generations will feel at home in a town that offers so much.

Our menu is produce-led and changes all the time, but our Cornwall chowder is very popular with mussels, squid and all sorts of seafood. Or there's our signature Harry Trotter beef burger with layers of pulled pork, bacon and a base of fig jam.

Come try our Christmas martini. It's a coffee-based martini with hazelnuts and butterscotch schnapps. Another good one is the Cornish Garden. Gin with elderflower, lemon and Sea Buck tonic made from sea buckthorn in St Ives. If you're coming for lunch, the Bookmaker steak melt is a bit of a flagship for us. It comes on a garlic ciabatta base with melted blue cheese and red onion marmalade. Or if you're not a meat eater, I recommend our fish tacos using local hake.
